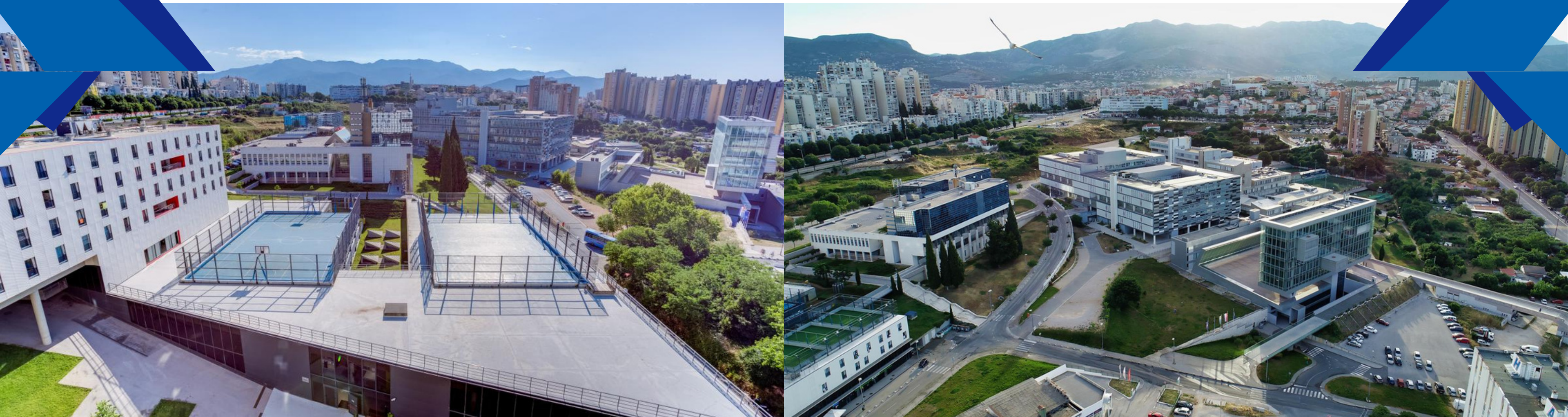

Accommodation

The University of Split has a limited number of rooms at the Student dormitory Hostel Spinut and Student dorm Campus.

IMPORTANT: The University of Split can only guarantee accommodation in the dorms for the duration of the academic year, so please plan your arrival/departure in accordance with the academic calendar. Student dorm hostel Spinut

Student dorm Hostel Spinut is categorized with 3 stars***. Hostel has 4 kitchenettes, a game room (TV, billiards, darts, table soccer etc.), a study room, an IT room, coffee bar/patisserie, restaurant, summer terrace and everyday 24-hour reception desk.

Dormitory is under video surveillance and secured overnight by security service. Being located in the very heart of the Marjan Hill it is surrounded by parks and forest park.

Erasmus students are accommodated in double rooms; **the monthly price per person in the amount of 190€ .**



Accommodation

Student dorm Campus

The dorm Dr. Franjo Tuđman located at the University Campus (opened in Autumn 2013) offers 10 places for Erasmus students. The dorm is within walking distance from the University Library and a lot of faculties. The dorm has a gym, party room, sports hall, 2 sports grounds, 3 kitchenettes, and 10 "classrooms", rooms intended for socializing, a restaurant and cafe bar.

Erasmus students are accommodated in single and double rooms; **monthly price per person in the amount of 200 € for a double room and 300 € for a single room.**

Please note that the rooms offered in the Student dorm Campus are located above the restaurant, where sometimes it can be noisy.

Health insurance

European Health Insurance Card (EHIC)

Students who are citizens of EU member states need to have the European Health Insurance Card. For more information click [here](#).

How to access health care services in Split?

- General health care services can be accessed by selecting a primary health care physician, whereas health care on other levels (e.g. hospital, specialist examinations) 8 PM can be accessed by way of a reference document (uputnica) issued by the selected physician. The student can choose any general physician. ESN Split or International Relations Office can assist you in choosing your physician.
- In very urgent cases the student can call the emergency service (phone: 194)
- In case student is provided with medical service, the same will be charged on the spot and the cost will be reimbursed in accordance with the terms of the insurance policy that the student has. If the student has HZZO health insurance policy, only the participation fees will have to be covered, if these are prescribed by Croatian laws.
- The pharmacies are called Ljekarna and during the week they are open all day long from 8 AM until 8 PM, while on Sundays and holidays one of the pharmacies in the center of the city is open 24 hours (you can find out which one here).

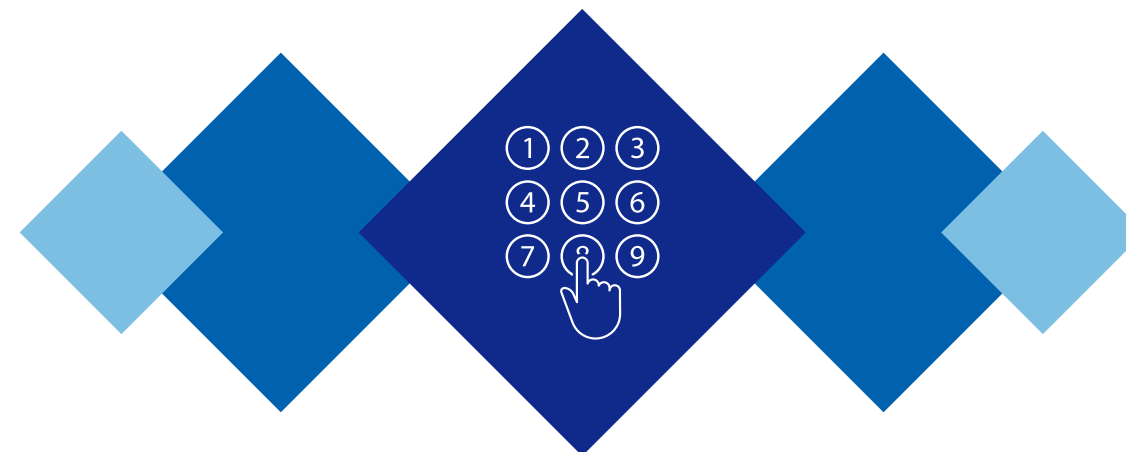
PIN (OIB) number

OIB (osobni identifikacijski broj) or Personal Identification Number is a number used for identifying natural and legal persons in the Republic of Croatia. Incoming students are required to apply for the assignment of a personal identification number. The number is issued by the Croatian Tax Authority and is required for enrolment and/or opening of a local bank account.

Incoming students can request an OIB in two ways:

1. A visit to the Tax Administration Office (OIB number can be requested personally and obtained immediately at: street Domovinskog rata 2, 2nd floor, room 4, office hours: 08:00-13:00, with break 10:30-11:00.)
2. You can apply online for your OIB

Since OIB is required even before your arrival for the preparation of your enrolment, please request it online as described in the following slide:



- You can get OIB by filling the aforementioned application form online, through the **“Pišite nam”** tab by clicking the following:

Along with this, you have to attach a scan of your identification (EU identity card or passport) and application for the determination and assignment of the personal identification number (oib) which you can find **HERE**, as well as writing you name, surname, email address and contact number. You also need to tick the box to accept the data processing.

Residence permit

- A residence permit is the prerequisite for issuing a transcript of records and letter of confirmation of the study period.
- Students need to check if their short-term stay is registered by the dorm or accommodation provider.
- All students must report their stay in Croatia to the Central Police Station within 2 days (48 hours) upon entering Croatia. Make an appointment by email: st.sidup@mup.hr
- There is also another option for applying for a residence permit. Scan the necessary documentation and send them via email to st.sidup@mup.hr and you will either receive a residence permit via email or receive an appointment to collect it personally after it's done.

The following documents must be presented with the application for temporary residence for the purpose of studying:

EU STUDENTS:

- Application form filled in and signed – **Form 1b**;
- valid passport or ID card and its copy;
- valid European Health Insurance card and its copy;
- Acceptance letter (original) from UNIST stating the study purpose of stay (ERASMUS+ students);
- Confirmation of enrolment issued by the Faculty (to be given after registration),
- Proof of sufficient means of subsistence during staying in Croatia - statement of bank account, scholarship confirmation OR similar - 110€ per month;
- OIB number document,
- Notarized or registered rental agreement with landlord* (for students accommodated privately) or confirmation of student residence issued by University office (for students accommodated in students' residence hall),



The following documents must be presented with the application for temporary residence for the purpose of studying:

NON – EU STUDENTS

- Application form filled in and signed- **Form 1a**;
- colour photograph 35x45 mm;
- administrative fee in the amount of 2,5 € (can be bought at newsstands);
- valid passport and copy of the first page with the photo;
- Acceptance letter (in original) from UNIST stating the study purpose of your stay (ERASMUS+ students);
- OIB number document;
- Proof of secured accommodation: if staying in the student dormitory, indicate which one, in case of private accommodation, valid rental contract or landlord presence and proof of ownership (vlasnički list) not older than 6 months
- Proof of the appropriate health insurance (bilingual document)
- Proof of the sufficient means of subsistence during staying in Croatia - statement of bank account, scholarship confirmation and similar -130 € per month
- Proof that he/she has no criminal record in his/her home state or in the state where he/she stayed for more than one year prior to arriving in the Republic of Croatia. List of countries requiring the Apostille formality: <https://gov.hr/en/authentication-legalisation-of-documents/476>

- The fee for temporary residence permit of non-EU student is 67 €.

Residence permit

- Temporary residence authorization for non-EU students is issued in the form of a biometric ID card of 32€, while for EU students is issued in the form of Confirmation, for both with validation until the end of the semester exam period.
- Students are strongly recommended to get all relevant original documents prior to arrival to Croatia. At the moment of application for a temporary residence, all documents should not be older than 6 months. All students, no matter the duration of staying in Croatia, must check with the local Croatian diplomatic mission: the obligatory validity of ID/passport (in months) to be longer than the actual stay in Croatia, whether the need for an “Apostille” of all original documents and certified translations exist.
- Students accommodated privately are strongly recommended to arrange notarized or registered rental agreement with landlord in order to avoid termination of the agreement from landlord’s side especially before summer season in June. Those students who decide to take a risk, instead of notarized or registered agreement, landlord should come to Police station with certificate of apartment’s ownership not older than 6 months confirming students accommodation on the address of the own apartment.

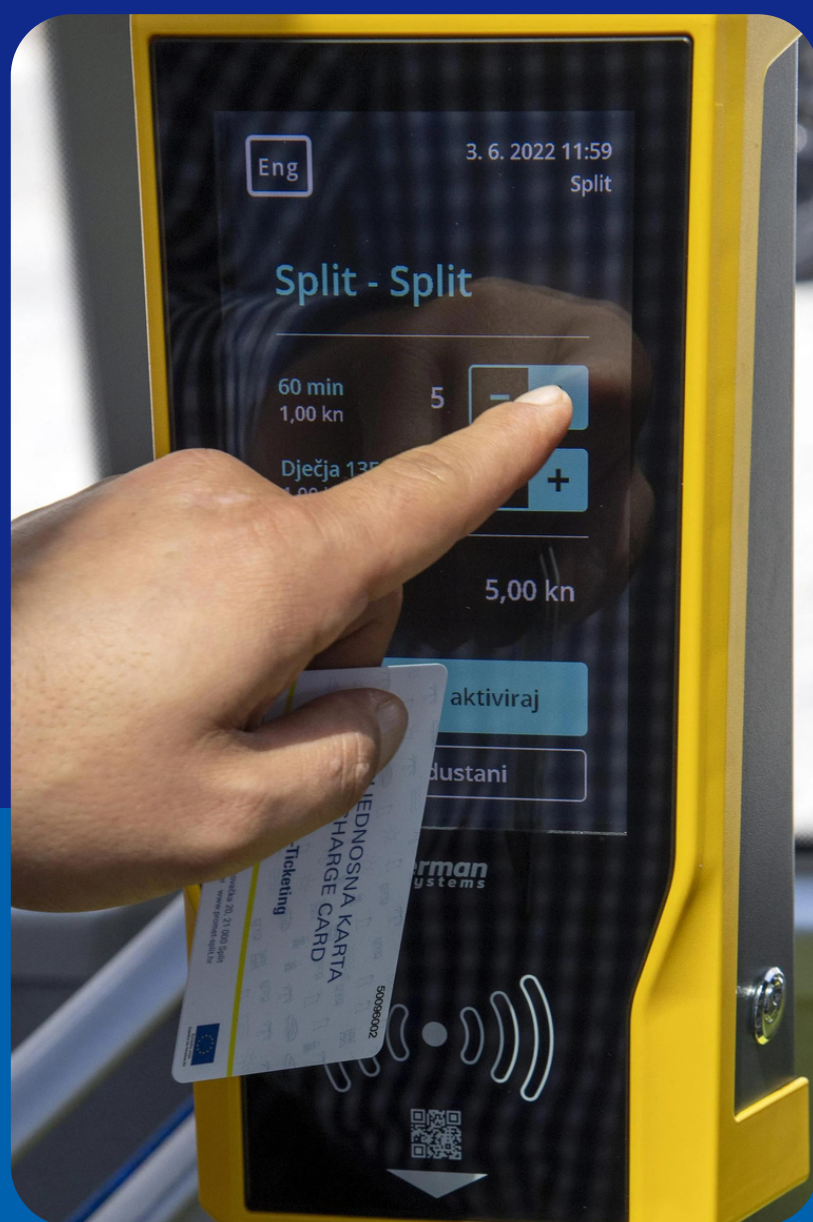
The cost of creating a contactless personalized ticket for the first issuance is 3 euro for all categories of passengers.

What to bring?

- For the first bus e-ticket (Zone 1- whole city):
- One photo 30x35 mm- that will only be scanned
- OIB number
- Acceptance letter
- ID/Passport
- 9.15 euro (price per month)
- 3 euro

How can students buy a monthly coupon for a personalized card?

All users of the personalized card can buy coupons in 3 ways:

1. At Promet sales points (Sukošanska ulica)
2. On the Moj Promet web portal (<https://moj.promet-split.hr/>)
3. On ticket machines

Renting a bike

You can also rent a public bicycle. There are 50 bicycles and 70 electric bicycles (E-BIKE) available on different locations around the city.

Prices:

- 26,54€ per 365 days (Bike and E-BIKE)
- Bike: 0,66€ for 30 minutes
- E-BIKE: 1,33€ for 30 minutes

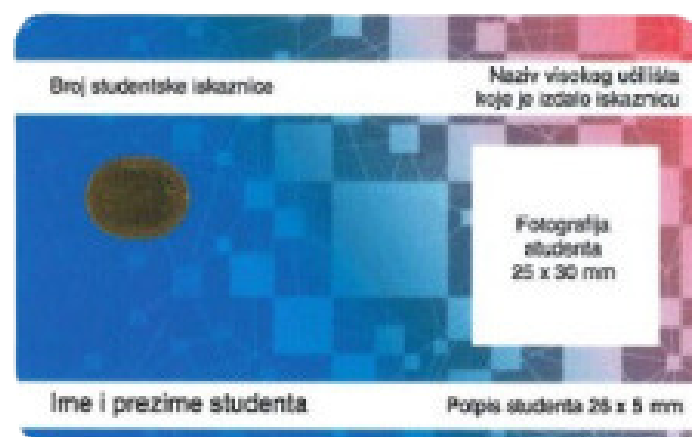

8. X-card (student identity card)

ERASMUS+ study mobility students, CEEPUS students, students of bilateral programmes of the Ministry of Science and Education and EU students are entitled to a student identity card (X-card) which enables them to have government subsidised student meals at Student restaurants (Croatian - menza) and cafeterias all over Croatia.



How to make X-card:

1. Student submits the following documents to the Student registration office/Erasmus coordinator (in accordance with the instructions received) of the host faculty:
 - scan of PHOTO (ID document format – face/without body) - 300x300 pixels;
 - Croatian OIB number.

Please respect pixels request and provide .jpg NOT .png and PDF format, otherwise we will not be able to proceed with card issuance.

Cost of the card is 7 €uro.

Instructions for payment will be given upon arrival.

Student X-card is not transferable, i.e. it can be used only by the cardholder.



9. Student restaurants

There is a number of student restaurants and coffee bars in which you can use your X-card.

The daily menu is announced here (in Croatian)

The price of a subsidized menu meal ranges from 0,63 - 0,82 €/meal for a three-course meal (soup, main course, salad and dessert). The weekly allowance is approx. 30 eur.

In order to access the services of the University Library and obtain the Library card, you need to present at the Library Reception desk the following documents:

X-card + ID/Passport + OIB + address + 6.64 € (one-time payment).

Upon payment you can use library as much as you want!

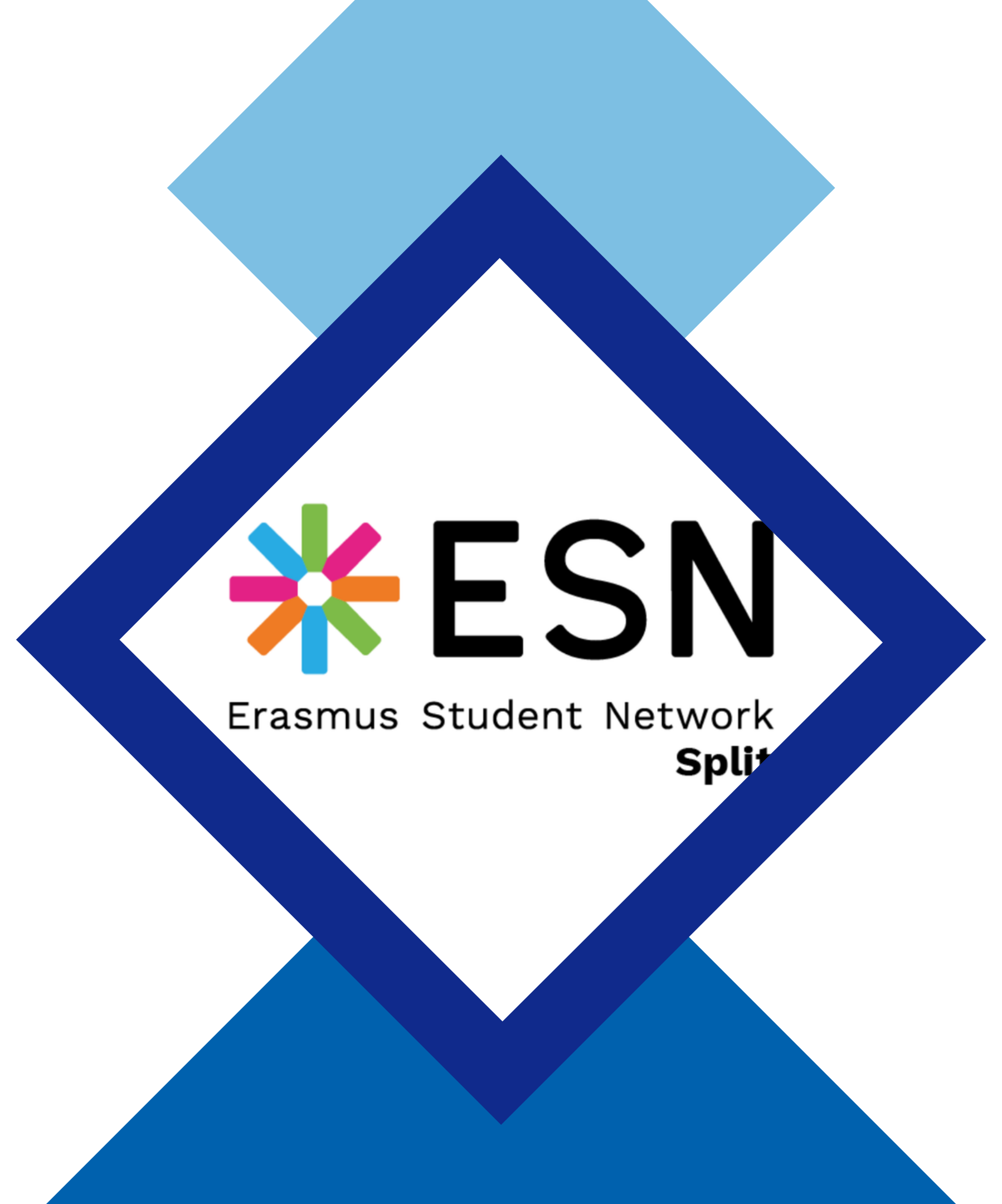
ESN Split
